Elementary Results

During the 2020-2021 school year TIS continued to be influenced by COVID related issues that impacted our ability to participate in many activities. We were very fortunate to be able to teach and learn face-to-face during this school year and our elementary students demonstrated growth and development in all subject areas.


With our concentrated effort focusing on reading, writing and phonics instruction in the primary grades we have noted a significant increase in student's competency in these areas. To assist students we added several reading programs including Readers and Writers Workshops, before school reading support, guided reading programs, and buddy reading for some students who were paired with older students. For those who completed the full year of reading, writing and phonics workshops, 74% are either meeting grade level expectations or excelling at their current grade level.

Our Elementary Provincial Achievement test results show 86% of students scoring the acceptable or above the acceptable standard of excellence in Reading Comprehension, 86% of students scored the acceptable standard or the standard of excellence in Writing, 79% of students showed the acceptable standard or the standard of excellence in Math Computation and 88% scored the acceptable standard or the standard of excellence in Math Concepts.

We are very proud of our students' ongoing efforts to excel in all subject areas.

Secondary Results 2020/2021

The 2021 School Year saw a slight relaxation of COVID-related restrictions. However, Grade 12 Diploma Exams were made optional throughout Alberta Education Schools and the majority of our students chose to write internally-created exams. The Grade 12 Diploma Course results show an increase in the number of students who achieved the Standard of Excellence, from 24.7% in 2019 to 36% in 2021. Looking at the overall results from Secondary, Grades 7-11 show strong growth across all subject areas. Excitingly, the number of students in all of Secondary who achieved the Standard of Excellence grew from 36.7% in the previous year to 47% in 2021.



International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

TIS offers the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) as an option to our Grade 11 and 12 students. The IBDP is an intensive 2-year academic programme that is offered concurrently with the Alberta High School Diploma programme. Students have the option of completing the full IB Diploma Programme or IB courses in specific subject areas. Recognised internationally, it is a challenging system that helps students prepare for University.



IB Courses

Students may choose to take one or more IB Diploma courses without fulfilling all of the requirements for a full IB Diploma. These courses are graded on a 1-7 scale, with 7 being the maximum grade. All IB Diploma courses have a set of externally graded assessments ranging between 60-80% of the final grade. Internally accessed coursework undergoes external moderation by the IB prior to the release of the final marks.

IB Diploma

Students pursuing an IB Diploma are required to take six IB Diploma courses. As part of the IB Core these students take a Theory of Knowledge Course (TOK), write an Extended Essay (EE), participate in Creativity Activity and Service (CAS) experiences. The TOK and EE are graded on an A-E scale. The achievement results in six IB Diploma courses with 42 points available. Three points are available from the result of TOK and EE combined. The maximum total points attainable in an IB Diploma is 45.

IB Diploma total points average (45 points available):












The TIS Advantage

This year saw an added challenge to our sports program as schools tried to balance between delivering high-quality education and a safe environment for staff and students. However, TIS was still able to host 23 competitive sports teams for students from grades 4 to 12. There were no overseas tournaments due to travel restrictions.

Instead, the spirit of competition was more locally based with student-athletes participating in the *DSEDJ inter-schools sports competition throughout the year. In swimming, the multi-day meet by DSEDJ is the highlight of the team's season. Tigers swimmers grabbed ten bronze, nine silver and nine gold medals. Incredible results! Chinese Culture

TIS includes various activities that incorporate Chinese culture into our classes. For example, in Chinese As A Second Language classes, students learn vocabulary using a variety of approaches, and flashcard games are one of them. In addition, students read, recognize and categorize vocabulary words in groups. The students explore the world around them in Chinese; they also reflect on virtues such as discipline and why self-discipline is important to us.

During the Chinese New Year, our students celebrate by learning about Chinese New Year stories and traditions and trying Chinese art and handicrafts. In 2021 even though we were still restricted due to COVID-19, we could still hold the dragon and lion dances for our students.







Fine Arts


TIS offers many diverse opportunities for students to express their creativity through art, music, drama, photography and multimedia.

A special kind of magic was brought to the Black Box Theatre by our Elementary students in the musical, *Peter Pan* in April. The cast and crew put in many hours of rehearsals to bring this performance to our community. The TIS Secondary Players presented two productions this year, *Same Room Different Story in Fall* written by TIS Alumna Mattea Li and a classic Greek Tragedy for it's spring production entitled, *Antigone, by Sophocles* - which was a play adapted by George Judy. Both productions involved many middle school and high school students participating in various roles - actors, musicians, dancers, singers, state managers, designers, lighting, sound, costume, makeup artists, hair stylists, and set production designers.



The grade 8's showcased their 2D and 3D Pop Art creations inspired by Swedish American sculptor Claes Oldenburg who is best known for his giant replicas of everyday objects. High School students also examined the characteristics of contemporary art in a wide variety of approaches including painting, photography and performance art. Our Art IB students excelled in creating a superb exhibition which is a mandatory examination component. The students donated 50% of the proceeds from their works in the silent auction to the Good Shepherd Macau, that provides relief services for women in crisis. They raised \$8,000MOP for the organisation and TIS couldn't be prouder of our student's strong community spirit.

Multimedia A students learnt about the basics of photography and film including storyboarding, scriptwriting, cinematography and audio production. Multimedia C students took their skills to the next level by learning about Photoshop and Illustrator, using these tools to create this year's Yearbook cover and restore/colorize old photos. Multimedia B took part in the first ever TIS Film Festival. Students presented incredible films that they created over a 5 month period. Several films were also submitted to Macau based ACAMIS Film competition. What amazing, creative students we have.



Another TIS first was to welcome Artist In Residence, Tomos Griffiths. He was able to enhance our already well established and successful performing arts program at the school. Developing performance based activities in students helps them to explore their creativity, improve confidence as well as teach teamwork; key cornerstones of the TIS philosophy.

Community Service

Unfortunately, TIS could not participate in the annual Run of Hope as a result of COVID-19 pandemic. Instead, the High School Student Council were very excited to bring back the Benefit Concert. Students were determined to use their talents to support our community. They saw a need to support people with mental health issues brought on and compounded by the pandemic. The students wanted to remove the stigma of seeking help by hosting a mental health awareness month. A highlight of the month was to host a Benefit Concert and donate the monies raised to the Macau Society of Registered Psychotherapists (MSRP). The funds raised went towards establishing an English-based online program designed to help young people. After months of hard work and practice, TIS students were able to raise \$21,670MOP for MSRP. What community minded students we have!





Our Activists In Residence included Mighty Greens & The Blissful Carrot. They imparted invaluable knowledge and inspired our students on how we can all help the planet by being responsible food consumers. Students got the opportunity to plant their own microgreens and care for them in the classroom. During experience week students worked to expand the TIS garden to provide more gardening space. The produce grown was donated to people in need in Macau through international NGO Oxfam.

Christmas holds a special place in all of our hearts and TIS's Christmas Giving Tree provides an opportunity for our students to take part in helping a disadvantaged child. It's a popular charity event with all names being claimed and presents donated so that another child may experience the joy of finding a present underneath their own tree. This is another way that we instill in our students a sense of duty and responsibility for others in this world.

TIS Joins The Global Movement

In 2015 the United Nations adopted 17 Sustainable Development Goals as an urgent call for action to achieve a more sustainable future for all. It called on all countries, communities, and individuals to protect the future of the planet. TIS felt that students need a good understanding of the issues they will face to take action to rise to the challenges of our changing world. By doing this, we are teaching our students the skills to solve problems and think critically. These goals are integrated into everyday lessons. For example, grade 10 students learned about inequalities and raised awareness by designing displays in the NW lobby. Kindergarten and elementary students learned about responsible consumption while Student Council,

and leadership students led events for Earth Day and Mental Health Awareness Month. The High School Eco-team students grew vegetables and donated them to local food drives. These activities all contribute to our students becoming well rounded, global citizens, a key TIS educational advantage.


University and College Placements

TIS is proud of our graduating students who have not only completed their final year of school, but received offers from 86 Universities worldwide.

Our rigorous and well rounded curriculum prepares students for life outside the classroom. TIS teachers and Academic Counsellors work alongside our students to ensure that they are supported throughout their final years and our results attest to this fact.

In the 2021 Academic Year, 56 students graduated with an Alberta High School Diploma of which 8 completed the full IB Diploma Programme at the same time. 43% achieved the Standard of Excellence. 99% of our students received University offers with 62% of students receiving offers from their first choice University. Many of our students opted to stay closer to home during these uncertain times rather than travelling abroad to study this year.

Overall, our Alumni are studying in diverse fields such as medicine, dentistry, law, engineering, business, architecture, design, film studies, music production, hotel management, education just to name a few. We are also proud to announce that in line with our Mission Statement to develop life-long learners, our graduates are also continuing their education with acceptances to top universities for their postgraduate studies.
